

Aim/context

To be able to count up in 1's.

Age group 4/5 years

The children will need to find any value up to 20p by counting 1 pence coins.

Objectives

- To be able to recognising numbers up to 20.
- To be able to count up to 20 objects.
- To use the vocabulary related to money.

Teacher tips

- Previous knowledge or experience needed
- The children should have had a lot of opportunities to count sets of objects up to 20.
- They should be confident in recognising numbers up to 10, and be able to recognise numbers up to 20 with support.

Resources

- Various coins up to 10p.
- Number line up to 20.
- Activity sheet 1** What's my value?

Key questions/prompts

- Can they read the total number that they are looking for?
- Model counting on in time while clicking on the pennies.
- Ask the children to count the total number of pennies that they have found at regular intervals.

Group activity ideas

1. Hide money in the sand/water tray and ask the children to find them and count how many they have found.
2. Use **Activity sheet 1** What's my value? The sheet shows a purse with a value on the inside. Give out some coins and ask the children to make rubbings of the right number of pennies to make the total value.
3. Plan a treasure hunt in the outdoor space, the children could follow a map to find pennies and then count them into the treasure chest at the end of the hunt-they could earn points for finding the most pennies.

Cross curricular links

- PSED**-To be able to maintain attention and concentrate.
